## ITEMS FOR INFORMATION

TITLE:	Updates on the Bye-Laws (Katie Badman)
MINUTES:	<b>KB:</b> The Students' Union is both a Charity and a Limited Company and therefore we are regulated by the Charity Commission. The Bye-Laws are easier to amend and they can be changed by the Student Union Council. They then go to the Governance Sub Committee which has been set up from last year, but we now need three more people to join as the Council representatives from last year have now graduated. JC-K noted that he was keen to continue and there was also interest from Dan O'Donoghue and Ciara Ansley.

TITLE:	A member of Union Council to become an RSU Trustee
MINUTES:	CN: The Trustee Board is the highest Governing Body the Students' Union report to and they are in place to make sure we are not doing anything to jeopardise the secure position of the SU. We need two members of the Council to sit of this Board and they will then report back to the other Council members.  Email Chuchu if you'd like to be a part of this.



TITLE:	Johanna Introduction/Election of Southlands Deputy President
MINUTES:	<b>JK:</b> Johanna is our new Student Voice Coordinator and explained that she'll also be in charge of Part Time Officer training.
	The preparations for the election of the Southlands Deputy President are also underway and candidates will be able to collect/download their nomination forms from the 9 <sup>th</sup> of October.

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TITLE:	Officers Priority for the Year
MINUTES:	CA: Wants to properly report hate crime and educate more people on the correct use of pronouns and how to deal with those students who are just coming out.
	RC: Advertise the prayer room in Froebel and make it more accessible. To get more people engaged in faith.
	Action Point — CN to include JC-K and RC in the Chaplaincy Management group.
	<b>BA:</b> To provide continued Mental Health Support and to tie this in with Mental Health Awareness day on the 10 <sup>th</sup> of October.
	TR: To get Whitelands recognition from other colleges.
	<b>TB:</b> As there's a whole new College team at Digby, it's just a case of getting their points across to the new members of staff.
	JC-K: Wants to make sure the food on campus complies with the multitude of faiths our students align themselves with. He also wants a Prayer Room revamp across all campuses.
	Action Point – CN to arrange Elior to come to an SUC Meeting
	<b>PE-M –</b> Wants to arrange Intra-Froebel events and build the college community.
	<b>DO:</b> Making sure the students are settled and that Fresher's know the points of contact around the College/University. To also work with Johanna on various Campaigns.
	<b>GW:</b> To support all Officers with Campaigns and to push Mental Health Awareness Day on the 10 <sup>th</sup> of October.



CN: Also wants to tap into the Mental Health Awareness day and bring the focus to men. Knows a Barber's shop whose staff are Mental Health trained and they provide free haircuts as part of a campaign called "Mind Your Head". **TF:** Continuing to make sure people are aware of the opportunities available to them and providing support and encouragement to this. SP: Last year the engagement on campus was low, so want to make sure this is much higher this year. LP: To make your academic experience more enjoyable and to push for no lectures to take place on Wednesday afternoons. **KM:** Keen to build an atmosphere on Whitelands with the inclusion of off-campus students. To create a presence on social media. CN: Will be focussing on internal issues until December. Looking at BAME attainment/inclusion and working on making this better. Wants to make our literary sources more diverse. Aim to decrease the inter-sectional barriers and what we can do as a student body in

order to achieve this.

TITLE:	Update on Vice-Chancellor Recruitment
MINUTES :	<b>CN:</b> Our VC Paul O'Prey is leaving in July 2019 and there have already been student focus groups to build up a profile of what the student body want to see in the new Vice Chancellor.
	120 people have applied and there has been a meeting where these 120 candidates have been whittled down to 13. Of this 13, only 3 are women and there is no BAME representation. We will be going back out to head hunt as we ideally want our leadership to be reflective of our demographic.  He will keep the Council updated as we hope to make an announcement before Christmas.
